

NEWSLETTER 31ST MARCH 2024 EASTER SUNDAY - YEAR B

I HAVE RISEN, AND I AM WITH YOU STILL, ALLELUIA.

YOU HAVE LAID YOUR HAND UPON ME, ALLELUIA. TOO WONDERFUL FOR ME, THIS KNOWLEDGE, ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA.

EASTER GLORY FILLS THE EARTH!

Last night we celebrated the most Holy night of the year, the most important feast in the Christian calendar. We kept watch together as the Lord passed over from death to life, and we celebrated the fact that as his followers we too pass over from death to life in baptism. We thanked God for all the signs of new life and new hope in our world and we committed ourselves once again to bring that promise into the lives of others. Last night we heard Mark's story of the empty tomb and how Mary Magdalene and the other women brought spices to anoint Jesus at the tomb, who sees the stone moved away. And Peter and the other disciple going there for themselves, seeing the burial sheets still there but the body gone. It is the Beloved Disciple who sees and believes.

Today we celebrate the empty tomb which is the sign of the victory of life over death, the victory of forgiveness over sin, the victory of hope over despair, the victory of joy over sorrow. The great stone that sealed the tomb shut was meant to keep the body of the dead Jesus out of sight and to keep him inside forever. In our own lives we have many great stones that trap us where we do not want to be.

We all have relationships that have broken down-with a family member, a neighbour, a work colleague—where it seems that nothing can be done to fix things. The glory of the resurrection has pushed that boulder aside and life has burst forth from its jail. The linen cloths used for burial were meant to keep the body wrapped up tightly. In our own lives we have many linen cloths that tie us down, that keep us trapped in an old way of life, unable to move, unable to let go. The glory of the resurrection has loosened the bonds of sin and freed us from the clutches of the living death that it brings.

Easter is our most Holy day of the year. Yet, every Sunday is a little Easter; indeed, every day, as the sun rises to extinguish the darkness of the night, is also a little Easter. Preaching to his community in North Africa in the fifth century, St Augustine of Hippo reflected on the fact that the joy and hope of the new life of Easter is meant to be a daily reality for us.

Dear friends, Though the disciples of Jesus came to believe in his resurrection after they encountered him alive, their understanding was not yet complete. Our own understanding of the resurrection gradually grows as we encounter the risen Christ, eat and drink at his table, and pour out our lives as he did.

Happy Easter everyone!

PASCHAL CANDLE: The priest lights the candle from the new fire, saying: "May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds." The people process into the darkened church following the deacon or priest who carries the candle high. The Easter candle is thus a pillar of fire leading us into the promised land. It is also a powerful sign of our unity as the Body of Christ. As we light our small candle from its flame, we are reminded that in "Christ our Light" we become the light of the world ourselves."
