When the family returned home, they were all carrying several palm branches. The little Johnny asked what are these palms for? They replied "People held them over Jesus' head as he walked by." "Wouldn't you know it," the boy guickly responded, " Just the only one Sunday I didn't go to Church, and


Today the Holy Mother Church celebrates the great feast of contradiction. It's Palm Sunday and it's also called Passion Sunday. The day of "Hosanna in the highest", and the day of "Crucify him! Crucify him!" It is a day of acclamation – "blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord", and also a day of denials - "I do not know him!" It's a day of paying homage - people throwing their cloaks on the road; but also a day of insults: "Play the prophet...who hit you then?"

In all this drama, we see different characters playing specific roles, starting from Peter who for lack of courage denied Jesus three times, to Joseph of Arimathaea who for his strength of courage took the body of Jesus for burial. What about us? What role are we playing today towards this ultimate sacrifice?

We play the role of the crowd and become like Peter when we neglect our prayer and depend on our personal strength. We play Judas when we live a life of hypocrisy – saying one thing and doing the other. We play Judas when we exploit the things of God for personal gain. We also play Judas when we make unfounded attacks on the Church of Christ and its leadership just because we have issues with certain teachings. Let us remember that we are like the chief priests and scribes when we persist in our sins and refuse to utilize God's offer of forgiveness.

Finally, dear brothers and sisters, as we begin our journey into the most Holy week in our Christian faith, and as Pope Francis assures us that through the suffering and death of Christ we have been called to a full spiritual communion with the body and blood of Christ each time we pray to God for strength and forgiveness. So, as we mark Jesus' triumph over death, let us thank God and ask Him for the strength to be strong and open till the end, as He shows-up today in triumph over defeat.

#### INFORMATION FOR ALL YOUNG PARENTS AND GUIDIANCE ACROSS OUR ST MARY'S PARISH SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITY REGARDING THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BRISBANE'S POLICY (2015) ON CHILDREN'S SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM.

In the year when the children turn eight (Yr 3), they are sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

In the year when the children turn nine (Yr 4), they are welcomed to the Lord's Table and receive First Holy Communion (Sacrament of Eucharist).

#### The Sacrament of Penance is a two – step process.

- A simple celebration of the second rite of the Sacrament of Penance in preparation for First Holy Commun-1. ion.
- 2. In the year when the children turn ten (Yr 5), they prepare for the Sacrament of Penance with individual confession and absolution (the first rite).

In our St Mary's parish, preparation Program is published via the School Newsletter and the Parish Newsletter. Parents are asked to carefully consider the seriousness and commitment involved in the preparation of your child/children to become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church. The Sacramental enrolment forms for Confirmation is available from the office at St Mary's Primary School. Parents could submit the completed forms through the school, by email or directly at the Parish Office.

So the order of the Sacramental program in our parish remains:

- 1. BAPTISM
- 2. CONFIRMATION
- 3. FIRST HOLY COMMUNION
- 4. PENANCE.

Please feel free to contact the parish office or any of our schools for more clarifications.

Finally, please do not forget to pick up the Confirmation form for your kid which is now available both in the parish office and at the primary school. The 2023 Confirmation will take place on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> of June at St Mary's Church by 8am. The six weeks prep. Lesson will commence on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> of April, being the parents Information night.

I am looking forward to a very Spiritually enriching Sacramental program this year.

HOLY WEEK & TRIDUUM: We together enter into the Holy Week (7days) from Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday. Triduum, the three days from sundown Holy Thursday to sundown Easter Sunday. A continuous celebration that observes the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus.
