ST MARY'S MARYBOROUGH

Today's gospel marks the beginning of a three-part series where Jesus instructs his followers on the way of life. Part One which is heard today, deals with the Law. Jesus says that it is not enough to keep the Ten Commandments, but that true virtue requires a deeper, sincerer observance. While the Law prohibited killing, Jesus exhorts his listeners not even to become angry.


Not only must adultery be avoided in a physical sense, but mentally as well. Jesus clearly demands more of his followers than strict obedience of rules and regulations. Rather, the aim is that God's law might transform a person's interior disposition and find wholehearted expression in outward action and loving relationship. The interpretation of the law through tradition is thus superseded by the authoritative teaching of Jesus.

The first reading introduces the theme of obedience, and the importance of steadfastly avoiding sin. It emphasises the human power to choose between good and evil, and warns that each person is responsible for the choices they make. This is followed by the responsorial psalm where the entire assembly proclaims, "Happy are they who follow the law of the Lord!"

The demands of Christian discipleship are set out in uncompromising fashion in this gospel. A thorough conversion of heart and mind is required, such that the purity of a person's inmost thoughts is reflected in the goodness of their outward actions.

Finally, Jesus declares that he has not come to abolish the Law, but requires more than blind outward obedience to the Law. Instead, he demands purity of heart and mind in addition to outward actions.
