THE SHEPHERDS WENT IN HASTE, AND FOUND MARY AND JOSEPH AND THE INFANT LYING IN A MANGER.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph: Family and covenant

The responsorial psalm ties the three readings together under the image of covenant - 'The Lord remembers his covenant forever.' In the first reading the promise of descendants which God makes to Abraham is ratified by a covenant-making ceremony (the description of which is omitted from the selection); Paul makes reference to the promise to Abraham as having been fulfilled in numerous offspring descended from Abraham's only beloved son, Isaac, who was to have been offered up in sacrifice and who foreshadows (i.e., is a 'symbol' of) Christ. The gospel describes Joseph and Mary fulfilling the obligations of the covenant as spelled out in 'the law of the Lord'.

Frequently covenants between individuals, clans, and tribes, even kingdoms, are described by using the language of family. In covenants between equals (e.g., two clan heads or two kings) the partners are called 'brothers' - the most famous biblical example is perhaps the covenant of friendship between Jonathan and David who become 'brothers' to one another (1 Sam 18:1-3; 2 Sam 1:25-26). In covenants between unequals (e.g., a great king and a petty king), the partners are referred to as 'father and son.' The language indicates the obligations owed to family members are owed also to those united in covenant. Such obligations are sacred and an individual is held duty-bound to fulfil them. While 'family' informs our understanding of covenant, covenant broadens our notion of family to include relationships beyond blood or marriage ties.

SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD (January 1st) The Word was Made Flesh and Dwelt Amona Us: When the

appointed time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born a subject of the Law, to redeem the subjects of the Law and to enable us to be adopted as sons.

Born of a woman, adoption, heir, conceived in the womb. When the eighth day came and the child was to be circumcised, they gave him the name Jesus. In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; now he speaks to us through his Son. May God bless us in his mercy.

Jesus, fully human, is also fully divine; therefore, Mary is the Mother of God. Since Jesus is born of a woman, we have received adoption as children of God. Because Jesus shares our humanity, we share his divinity. The consequence of this event is that we have been raised to the royal status of heirs, children of God.

Finally, dear brothers and sisters, going by this sacred Christian teaching, we are all one family, and we ought to draw our inspiration from the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph who gave us what the world cannot give. Let us therefore pray that the Holy Family may guide and guard us safely through the new year of 2024 with a renewed spirit to always do the will of God.
