

SEEING THE FACE OF JESUS IN EVERYONE AROUND US

As the post resurrection epiphany continuous, the disciples' frustration and misfortune grew even higher. As Jesus was their great hope and his crucifixion meant for them the end of a dream. Hence, they failed once again to recognize Jesus because they were too absorbed with their worries and regrets.

How often do we get so consumed by our own regrets and problems that we fail to see the face of Jesus in the needy around us? Do we realize that Jesus is always with us no matter the concerns we face? He understood the frustration of his disciples, iust as he understands ours. He knew they needed to vent all their bottled-up emotions before they could listen to him. Patiently he walks with them to their destination.

Therefore, the resurrection was for Jesus the dividing line between earthly life when he was limited to the form of a male, Jewish body, and risen life when he is no longer limited in this way. The risen Lord now appears in all types of bodies: male and female, White and Black, young and old, rich and poor, handicapped and non-handicapped, native and immigrant, Catholic and Protestant, Christian and Moslem, liberal and conservative, and so on and so forth. Though we may see those who are different from us as strangers, today's gospel challenges us to start seeing them simply as companions on the way. When we reach out to them in hospitality we reach out to God and attract a blessing to ourselves.

Let us pray today for the grace to overcome the crippling fear of doubt and unbelief, for the courage to reach out with open hearts and open hands to those who are different from us, knowing that even though the strangers on our way may not look like Jesus, they may indeed turn out to be Jesus just like the lonely stranger on the way to Emmaus.
