It is not easy to welcome the stranger, but Jesus insists that is exactly what we need to do, and that in welcoming the anger, we welcome him.

The Gospel challenges us to reflect on the real "cost" of ving and maintaining faith in Jesus Christ as well as on how we ate to one another as disciples of Jesus Christ. Do we welme the stranger in our midst? Do we welcome those who me and worship with us on Sunday, especially those who may not be members of our parish? Do we welcome into our community those who are in special need? "Whoever welcomes me [Jesus] welcomes the one who sent me" (10:40).
