The gospel addresses the problem of the delayed ousia (= the return of Christ in glory; see Advent 1). This able of the ten maidens describes Christians who are wise thus prepared, and some who are foolish and thus repared. When the bridegroom (= Jesus) returns econd Coming), judgment will take place: the wise will be nitted to the banguet (see Sunday 27) but the foolish will shut out. Similar images of separating and judgment are nd in the parables of the weeds and wheat (13:24-43 day 16), the fishnet which gathers both good and bad fish 47-50 - Sunday 17), and the sheep and goats (25:31-46 ist the King).

In each case the good will be separated from the bad on ment day. Positively, the delay of Christ's coming means there is time for the foolish to change their lives in order be properly prepared (cf. 2 Peter 3:9). But the delay will be indefinite; indeed, the bridegroom could come at any ment.

The 'wise' and the 'foolish' were also discussed in the able of two men who build their houses, one on sand and other on solid rock; when the storm comes (i.e., the -time crisis) the wise who built on rock will stand, but the lish will be swept away (7:24-27/Sunday 9, displaced this r). In both parables one's 'wisdom' is measured by taking on that will assure a favourable judgment.

The first reading offers a consoling complement to ables of preparedness and judgment. In such parables it ms that all the work and effort is up to Christians: we st eagerly seek out that wisdom which leads to salvation. 'wisdom' also seeks us out. In Wisdom literature 'wisdom' is personified as an aspect of God's presence. When Lady Wisdom (see Proverbs 8, Sirach 24) 'hastens to make herself known' (Wis 6:13), 'seek[s] those worthy of her,' 'graciously appears to them . . . and meets them with all solicitude' (6:16), it is God who is reaching out. In our thirst for God (responsorial psalm), God in Christ actively seeks us out. Peace be with you!


