READINGS

Isaiah 55:6-9

My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways

Last Sunday, the gospel invited us to reflect on how often we can forgive our brothers or sisters. This Sunday, the question is on how much love, not time, we give to our Christian obligations. Bearing in mind that what is paramount is not the amount of time or service that we render but the love in which the service is carried out. In God's eyes, a thousand years is like a day, all services, big or small are important and will be rewarded according to God's plan. As the First Reading says: "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways" (Isaiah 55:8).


The Lord gives this warning because he wants us to have interior peace. Nothing upsets our peace of mind more than the craving for affirmation and esteem. When we are always comparing ourselves to others, we are prone to worries, envy, stress, anger, and uncertainty. But if we simply try to give our best in life for Christ, thinking more of the glory of God than of self, and recognizing the abundant generosity of God's love towards all, then our trust in him will grow, those selfish motives will shrink, and we will begin to experience that peace that the world cannot give.

A story was told about Greg an engineer who works in a construction firm that builds houses. He told himself: "I have been working hard for this company and what do I get? "I'm about to retire all my life, I am only making beautiful mansions for the rich people."

One day the owner of the construction firm said to him: "I want you to construct a large and lovely house. I don't care about the budget. I just want it done well." But since Greg was filled with envy and resentment to his work, he wanted to embarrass the owner. "Anyway," he said to himself, "I would be retiring soon." So he built the house with sub-standard materials: rusty steels and roofs, old wood and fixtures. The façade was so impressive but he knew it would not last because of the poor quality of work and materials.

Finally, the time came for him to retire. During his retirement party, the owner said to Greg: "As my gratitude to you for your services in the company, I'm giving you the house that I instructed you to build. It was meant as a surprise for you." Regrettably, Greg wanted to complain but at that time it was too late.

Dear friends, let us recognise that each one of us is uniquely made and gifted by God, and each is equally important in the eyes of God. let us not allow envy to destroy all that we have laboured for in this world. Because it is not so much about the time we spent, but the measure of love in which the service is carried out. Therefore, let everyone enter into the joy of the Lord!" AMEN. Peace be with you!
