

TURN YOUR EAR, O LORD, AND ANSWER ME; SAVE THE SERVANT WHO TRUSTS IN YOU, MY GOD.

HAVE MERCY ON ME, O LORD, FOR I CRY TO YOU ALL THE DAY LONG.

But you, who do you say I am?

The above Jesus' question in Matthew's gospel today resonates in the heart of a young person struggling with addictions and the glamour of sin. It's a question that whispers in the minds of a couple striving to keep the right balance in their relationship. The question is pondered by the widow or single mum struggling to provide for her young children, during the time of inflation and high cost of living. It is a question contemplated by the public servant faced with the challenge of serving with integrity and compassion. The same question bothers the mind of a priest or religious struggling with the demands of his/her vocation. We all need to answer this question in our everyday decisions if we are to have the right relationship with the Lord.

An elderly man was invited to his old friends' home for dinner one evening. He was impressed by the way his buddy preceded every request to his wife with endearing terms such as: Honey, My Love, Darling, Sweetheart, etc. The couple had been married almost 70 years, and clearly, they were still very much in love. While the wife was in the kitchen, the man leaned over and said to his host, "I think it's wonderful that, after all these years, you still call your wife those loving and adorable pet names. "The old man scratched his head and responded very slowly "I have to tell you the truth," "I forgot her name about 10 years ago."

Unlike Peter, in today's gospel, who after going through many years of tribulations and persecution with Jesus and the other disciples did not forget who Jesus truly is, as he spoke up, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.' By so doing Peter acknowledged Jesus for who he really is, His mission on earth, not just because of the protections he got in following him, rather in appreciation of what he has done for us. As St Paul clearly states, "while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8) in the end, Jesus was pleased with Peter's answer and finally gave him the keys to the kingdom of Heaven.

It is therefore up to each one of us to seek God's wisdom in answering this all- powerful question such that we can avoid seeing Jesus in a give-and-take mindset in our faith journey. When life is good we praise the Lord but when difficult moments arise, like sickness or death in the family, we start to grumble that God has let us down, and such questions arise as to why God would let us suffer. We've all heard statements like: "Why did God allow disease into the world? Why am I still without a child? Why did God let my wife die? Why am I still without a good job after many years of graduation? I go to Mass every day and do a lot of good works in the parish, so why is all this happening to me? This obviously calls for self-examination by each one of us!

Finally, dear friends, as we re-acknowledge today the foundation of the Church of Jesus Christ on the Rock of Peter, may we continue to pray for His Successor Pope Francis, the bishops, priests, Religious and all women and men of faith, that all may mirror the image of Jesus the good Shepherd, who offered his life as a ransom for many.




