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

# Follow your conscience: God or Caesar?

The most important part of a ship is the rudder. Without the rudder it could not be steered. It would simply sink. The most precious thing we possess is our conscience. Without a conscience we could not steer the barque of our lives towards the harbour of truth and right.

Today there are so many forces vying for control of our conscience. In our modern world today, it is easy to sell one's conscience or to hand it over to someone else. But as Christians God must always have the first claim on our conscience. As Christians, most importantly as modern time Catholics, we are often faced with difficult decisions about our faith. But we have been given an inner voice to guide us, namely, the voice of conscience. How well do we listen to this voice? For instance, am I at peace with my conscience right now?

First Reading (Isaiah 45:1.4-6). The return of the people from exile under King Cyrus is seen not merely as a sign of God's love for his people but of his lordship over all people.

Second Reading (1 Thessalonians 111-5). This contains the opening lines from Paul's first letter to the community of Christians he founded at Thessalonica. His concern for them shines through.

Gospel (Matthew 22:15-21). To trap Jesus into saying something incriminating, his enemies ask him whether it is right for a Jew to pay taxes to Caesar.

Jesus replied, give Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God'. Today I suppose you could say that Caesar's place is taken by the secular State, that is, the State which is not so much against God as without God. It is a State which no longer bases its law on God's laws but have a complete separation between Church and State.

At times this can pose serious dilemmas for us as Catholics involved in public office. As we cannot impose our own moral values and beliefs on others, yet we must not take part in what, from a Christian/ catholic viewpoint, is morally wrong. But it's not only those in public office that must face difficult situations. Every Christian living in the modern world is faced with them. There are so many little 'Caesars' vying for a piece of our conscience. There is the party, the company, the club, etc. All clamour for our loyalty, all are eager to claim a piece of our conscience.

Dear brothers and sisters, let us resist these forces and be strong in following our consciences, so that we may always give God the first and highest claim of our loyalty and fidelity.

Now that the referendum result is known, it's time to look forward rather than look back. A second thing is still clearer and more urgent: the search for reconciliation based on truth and justice must continue, even if the referendum process and result have made that more difficult. This too is something that can't be left to the politicians, because again there's more to it than politics.

After this result at Federal level, the focus will have to move to the States. But it will also have to move to non-government organisations like the Churches. The Australian Catholic bishops have spoken of the need for a new engagement with Indigenous peoples, and that now becomes more pressing. In the Archdiocese of Brisbane we will commit ourselves more resolutely to our Reconciliation Action Plan and keep asking what else we can do. Fine words and symbolic gestures are not enough.

The process leading to this vote has been a highly politicised slog that has changed Australia, and not for the better. Now the real work begins. It's up to all of us to ensure that what we do from here serves national unity and racial justice, because we'll never have the first unless we have the second.
