ARCHBISHOP MARK COLERIDGE ANNOUNCES NEW AUXILIARY BISHOP OF BRISBANE

At this time of great change and challenge, it is a joy for the Church in Brisbane and Australia to welcome the appointment of Fr Tim Norton SVD as Auxiliary Bishop of Brisbane. In some ways it is a surprising appointment, but Fr Tim brings to the ministry of bishop many gifts and experiences required now more than ever as the whole Church seeks to become more missionary.

Born in Sydney in 1958, Tim entered the Divine Word Missionaries in 1984 and was ordained Priest in 1991. He then served in Mexico for seven years before undertaking studies in spiritual direction to prepare for formation work in Melbourne preparing men to serve as Divine Word Missionaries. He was then elected Provincial of the Australian Province and in that role he had close contact with the Archdiocese of Brisbane where the SVD have been and still are an important presence. Since completing his term as Provincial, Tim has been the Director of the *Ad Gentes* course of renewal based at the SVD house in Nemi near Rome. All of this will equip Tim well for what awaits him in the episcopal ministry in this time and in this place. He will make a real contribution not only locally in Brisbane and Queensland but also nationally and internationally. He comes to us as God's gift and we give thanks to the giver of all gifts. We also welcome Tim as a brother in faith and in mission. Details of the Ordination will follow and in the meantime we pray for Tim asking the Lord to breathe into him in a new and deeper way the Holy Spirit who enables us to hear God's Word and speak it to others.

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE
*The Lord sits as King for ever,
The Lord will bless his people with peace.*

Jesus the Servant-King

The Holy Mother Church today celebrates the Solemnity of Jesus Christ as the Universal King on this last Sunday of the liturgical year. Pope Pius XI instituted this Feast in 1925, calling on humanity to submit once more to the authority of Christ who came to serve and not to be served. With our common knowledge of kingship, every king has a throne symbolizing his power and authority from where he administers justice, conducts diplomatic relations, receives petitions and issues his commands. The throne reminds the people that the king is not just another citizen; he is the supreme authority. The throne is the symbol of this unique royal identity. Our Lord Jesus Christ as the eternal King of the universe has a throne too but his throne differs radically from those of the kings of this world. While the kings of the world rule from thrones of great power and influence, our Jesus' throne is a lowly one where he lies down in weakness; in a position of surrender to those who nailed him to a cross.

The cross is rough, plain wood; its only decoration is the blood of the king who gave up his life for the salvation of his people. The rulers of the world slaughter animals of choice to entertain their guests but Jesus gives his own body as food and his own blood as drink. The kings and queens of the world, when they are about to die, divide their kingdoms amongst their relatives and cronies; but Jesus, having no estates to share, offers himself as a ransom for our sin – as a memorial: "Do this in memory of me!" he says and then gives away his own mother to his followers.

In the kingdoms of the world, everything is done to exclude strangers, to keep them "offshore" and the rulers say to them: "Go back to where you came from" but in the Kingdom of Christ, everything is done to welcome strangers, even many servants of the kingdom shed their blood to facilitate the inclusion of "outsiders" and the King says to them: "In my Father's house are many mansions" (John 14:2) – there is room for everyone. This is the distinctive character of our Lord Jesus Christ, the universal King, whom we celebrate today.

In the Gospel, Pilate questions Jesus about his alleged claims to be a king. Jesus clearly explained that his kingdom is not of this world so he shifts the emphasis to the Kingdom of Heaven, where he wears a crown not of gold but of glory and honour and where he receives tributes not in taxes but in worship and fidelity to the truth. In the words of Pope Benedict XVI, "Jesus did not come to rule over peoples and territories but to set people free from the slavery of sin and to reconcile them with God." Dear brothers and sisters, Jesus, by sharing in our suffering, actually allows us to share in his kingship, to join him on his throne, if only we unite our sufferings to his, if only we place our crosses on his altar of mercy and love. Let us therefore ask the servant-king Jesus Christ to grant us humility to follow the path of love and service for it is only through him, with him and in him that we will attain the deepest longings of our hearts.
